Steven Thomas Cox, 41, of Dover-Foxcroft, formerly of Brewer, died unexpectedly at his home April 8, 1998, as the result of a heart attack. He was born in Bangor, Nov. 2, 1956. He graduated from Brewer High School, attended Husson College, and graduated from Oklahoma Farrier College. Steven was employed by the Bangor Hydro-Electric Co. for 17 years and in more recent years was self-employed as a blacksmith. He was a well-known horse trainer and breeder of quarter horses. He had served for 16 years as a member of the board of directors of the Maine Quarter Horses Association, and first vice-president for five years. He loved his dog, Hydro, all his many horse "friends", and loved being a cowboy. Surviving are his wife, Marianne Cox of Dover-Foxcroft; three children, Thomas Gerald Cox of Amherst, Theresa Ann Cox of Dover-Foxcroft, and Melinda "Mindy" Suzanne Cox of Dover-Foxcroft; his father, Tom Cox and stepmother, Suzanne Cox of Hampden; his mother, Alberta A. Washburn and stepfather, Raymond O. Washburn of Orrington; one sister, Suzanne J. Biardi of Scarborough; one brother, Michael S.
